Speakers: Bill Forstner and Allyson Labban: “Ethical Dilemmas in Case Management”

Bill Forstner works as in-house counsel at WakeMed Health & Hospitals, where he is responsible for managing all claims and litigation (professional negligence, medical malpractice, commercial disputes) and providing daily advice on patient care issues, such as involuntary commitment, patient consent, guardianship, privacy, EMTALA, and medical record documentation. Before joining WakeMed’s in early 2016, Bill was in private practice and focused on complex health care litigation, regulatory, and medical-legal issues.

Before joining WakeMed’s in-house department in June 2018, Allyson was a partner at Smith Moore Leatherwood LLP in Greensboro. Her practice focused on HIPAA and regulatory compliance, including assisting hospitals and other clients with federal fraud and abuse investigations, ZPIC and other audits, OCR investigations, licensure and survey concerns, and bioethical and risk management assessments.

Melissa Godwin is a clinical social worker who has a Clinical Assistant Professor appointment at UNC Chapel Hill School of Social Work. She has provided women’s gender responsive substance abuse services technical assistance and training in North Carolina since 2004, under the auspices of NC DMH/DD/SAS. Her current role at UNC Chapel Hill is based on a contract with NC DMH/DD/SAS, serving as the Work First/Child Protective Services Substance Abuse Initiative Coordinator since 2007, in addition to continuing her work around women and substance use disorders. Her clinical work has included direct practice in community health centers with high risk pregnant women, women’s outpatient substance abuse treatment, and prevention services with adolescents and school based mental health. She received her Master’s in Clinical Social Work in 1998 from Boston University School of Social Work.
